This Wreath is part of a series of four you can stitch and display in your home throughout the year, for a little seasonal touch. We love their vintage feel.

The autumn wreath features golden foliage and berries, gracefully mixed with ornamental stitches.

The basis of the stitching is cross stitch, with added backstitch detail. The pattern is enhanced with purple and ivory seed beads, gold metallic thread and 2 variegated threads from the DMC Variations range.

If you are not yet familiar with these specialty stitches, you will also be introduced to the lazy daisy stitch and woven spider web stitch, guided by excellent step by step tutorials.

You will also find that the two step charts provided by Faby Reilly, one with cross stitch only, one with all stitches prove to be particularly user-friendly for stitchers of all levels.

A tutorial is included with the chart for all specialty stitches.

Needlework fabric: 28 ct Zweigart Cashel linen, 770 platinum

Stitched size 4 1/2 x 4 1/2 inch (11 x 11 cm)

Stitches: cross stitch, backstitch, lazy daisy, spiderweb stitch

Chart: Two step color chart : with cross stitch only + with all stitches

Threads: DMC, DMC color variations, Rainbow Gallery Petite Treasure Braid (PH01 Gold)

Number of colors: 13

Themes: fall leaves, autumn foliage, berries
